This is a picture of Trusty before she came to Rainbow. She is practicing her jumping skills!


This is a photo of what Copper used to do before coming to Rainbow. He was a driving horse. Copper would pull wagons and farm equipment.



Rainbow is very lucky to have generous people contact us with horses they think might work in our program. The first thing we do is ask all kinds of questions over the phone or by email. How old is your horse? Horse between the ages of 10 and 20 years probably will be best. How tall is the horse? What has your horse done in the past? Does this horse have any lameness issues? This mean, does the horse have any injuries of soreness that makes it hard for him to move or do the job. Can the horse walk, trot and canter comfortably? If all this sounds good then we schedule a time to go visit the horse. This usually means that Miss Marissa, Miss Mary or Miss Vicki pack up their helmets and boot to go "test ride" the horse. If the horse looks

good and healthy and is well-behaved we give it a try.






This is a chart of different type of foods that horses can eat and can not eat. The reason horses can not eat some of these foods are because they cause:


- Heart problem




